

MINUTES OF THE MARGARETTA BOARD OF EDUCATION SPECIAL MEETING OF MARCH 8, 2010.

The Margarettta Board of Education met in special session at 8:00 A.M. on Monday March 8, 2010 at the Administrative Offices.

Mr. Lippert called the meeting to order with roll call; Mr. Stark, Mr. Myers, Mr. Bodey, and Mr. Lippert; Mr. Rankin was absent.

Mr. Lippert welcomed those in attendance and explained the purpose of the special meeting was to determine whether or not the Board should resolve to take the necessary steps to terminate Sally Smith from her teaching contract. He stated that if the board resolves to begin the process today that it does not mean that Sally is terminated today. This procedure is necessary to allow for the district to investigate the circumstances that may lead to termination.

Mr. Lippert allowed John Zang, president of the Margarettta Teachers Association to make comments. Mr. Zang stated that Sally has been an excellent teacher in this district for over twenty-five years. He went on to state that Sally is a graduate of Margarettta Schools, has lived in this community all of her life and has been a positive influence on children who have had her as teacher.

Mr. Lippert thanked John for his comments.

Motion by Mr. Myers, second by Mr. Bodey to enter executive session to discuss a personnel matter; Roll Call: All present Aye.

The Board entered executive session at 8:05 a.m. with Mr. Kurt, Mr. Hammond and Attorney Bill Pepple in attendance.

Motion by Mr. Bodey, second by Mr. Myers, to return from executive session; Roll call: All Present: Aye.

Motion by Mr. Myers, second by Mr. Bodey, to adopt Board Resolution number 09-10-69, resolving the intention of the Board to consider termination of a teaching contract with Sally Smith; Roll Call: All present Aye.

Motion by Mr. Myers, second by Mr. Bodey to adjourn the meeting having no further business to come before the Board; Roll Call: All present Aye.

The meeting adjourned at 9:03 A.M.
